- 1. This application takes a very long time and a large amount of resources from our group. Should we continue pursuing it? Are there alternatives for recognition of our efforts?
- 2. Transportation Equity Network Affiliation

- 3. Formalize cooperation with adjacent communities
  - a. Formally approach surrounding communities and attempt to align our efforts.
  - b. Make sure we aren't building bike routes / lanes into an area of an adjacent community that would result in a sudden lack of signage / infrastructure
  - c. Invite representatives (voting? Non-voting?) to sit on our board from Granville, Star City, Westover
- 4. Bicycle-Related Policy Compliance
  - a. Regarding our parking infrastructure and complete streets policies...
  - b. Develop an "implementation checklist" or at least short documents for any new development with links to external guidelines, vendors, and examples.

  - c. 20 d) What tools are in place to ensure policy compliance? (we indicated that we have a local complete streets policy but also parking policies) we checked the following boxes:
    - i. a requirement to go through an admin process if no bicycle pedestrian facilities are proposed
    - ii. implementation guidance
    - iii. design manual
    - iv. oversight by bike board.
